MAS 90 and MAS 200 4.0 Ready for Prime Time

Windows XP Service Pack 2

Microsoft is just releasing Service Pack 2 for Windows XP. While in the long run it's security enhancements will be a good thing, since it does change many of the default settings in Windows, it should not be deployed without testing how it will affect users in your environment.

The following is an official announcement from Best Software:

“Upgrading to Windows XP Service Pack 2 is not recommended by Best Software at this time. Best Software is currently conducting compatibility testing. Once Windows XP Service Pack 2 is approved for use with our products, we will be updating our supported platform and system requirements documents with Windows XP Service Pack 2 information.”
